

Flag Etiquette

- The flag is normally flown from sunrise to sunset.
- In the morning, raise the flag briskly. At sunset, lower it slowly. Always, raise and lower it ceremoniously.
- The flag should not be flown at night without a light on it.
- The flag should not be flown in the rain or inclement weather.
- After a tragedy or death, the flag is flown at half staff for 30 days. It's called "half staff" on land, and "half mast" on a ship.
- When flown vertically on a pole, the stars and blue field, or "union," is at the top and at the end of the pole (away from your house).
- The American flag is always flown at the top of the pole. Your state flag and other flags fly below it.
- The union is always on top. When displayed in print, the stars and blue field are always on the left.
- Never let your flag touch the ground, never...period.
- Fold your flag when storing. Don't just stuff it in a drawer or box.
- When your flag is old and has seen better days, it is time to retire it. Old flags should be burned or buried. Please do not throw it in the trash.





When a local developer is found dead, the Club finds itself in the middle of a live case. The friends might be septuagenarians but they are cleverer than most. Red Ron, an infamous former socialist firebrand still causes trouble whenever he can; gentle Joyce takes note of everyone's thoughts and actions in her diary, but she's not as innocent as she seems; Ibrahim is a former therapist who understands the darker side of human nature; and Elizabeth, whose background is still not quite clear, is definitely a woman to underestimate.

This is a flat-out pleasure of a book to read, especially right now, when the outside world seems to be a bit tacky around the edges. 
