



Johnny Appleseed

Wow, what a great tour we had on August 21st! There was rain, a lost leader, an actual guest speaker, and some really interesting back country. Really!

We started out, as usual, at the old Sears parking lot, with 7 Model As, and moderns. We tootled all the way down Route 192 (in drizzle and almost-rain) to the back side of Carpinteria, where we turned onto 150, and then up Gobernador Canyon. After Lorne got lost and figured it out, we ended up in an area off of Stanley Park Rd, where we met several members of the Ventura Model A Club.

This part of the back hill country was once owned by the Shepard family, and in the late 1800s had two lodges that were popular with folks from Hollywood (like John Barrymore, who apparently slept off a hangover in the little old ice house that still stands on the property). One lodge was called The Stanley Park Lodge, and the other was Shepard's Inn, and from 1890 to 1922 you could rent a cabin for \$18 a week. It was only 300 yards from the main stagecoach route from Los Angeles—it is hard to realize that the coastal route didn't exist back then!

Both lodges were burned in the fires, and the surrounding avocado orchards suffered, but are coming back. Meanwhile, the wildlife loves the area, and there are deer, chipmunks, bobcats, bear, and oh, yes, rattlesnakes. A family of ducks likes the little stream there, and it was altogether a charming, and peaceful scene. The Los Padres National Forest completely surrounds the property.

Our thanks to Richard Slyker of the Ventura Club for setting up our visit and providing the speaker, Ron Prechtl, who told us of the history of the area, and owner of the avocado ranch.

The next stop was lunch at iHop in Carpinteria, followed by a visit to the small but interesting local history museum (with one Model A).




My To-Read list

OK, it's time to check out the new books for the end-of-summer, and the beginning of the Fall season. Here is my current list, starting with the book I am taking on our vacation to Hawaii:

- (1) *Shuggie Bain*, by Douglas Stuart. I picked up this book as soon as I saw it in Chaucer's. First of all, it is about a boy growing up in Glasgow, and secondly, it received the 2020 Booker Prize, Britain's most prestigious literary award. I'll review it in the next issue.
- (2) *The Man Who Died Twice*, by Richard Osman. Osman's previous book was *The Thursday Murder Club*, and the same 4 septuagenarians are on the trail of murderers and stolen diamonds in their deluxe retirement village.
- (3) *The Madness of Crowds,* by Louise Penny. <u>Any</u> book by Ms Penny is worth reading in my opinion. This is the latest tale of Inspector Armand Gamache of the Québec Sureté, and his family and friends in the small remote village of Three Pines.
- (4) *Harlem Shuffle*, by Colson Whitehead. This author is known for his last two books, which both won Pullitzer Prizes: *Underground Railroad*, and *The Nickel Boys*. Can he keep it up with this story of a family in 1960s Harlem?
- (5) A Slow Fire Burning, by Paula Hawkins. Last moth I reviewed a novel about narrowboats in England, so this month I am adding this story about a London houseboat. 3 women, a dead man, and lots of red herrings!
- (6) *Hamnet*, by Maggie O'Farrell. Recommended by a trusted friend back east, this book is the fictional story of Shakespeare's son, Hamnet, who died at age 11 in 1596.
