

Halloween

Halloween or Hallowe'en (a contraction of "All Hallows' evening"), [also known as Allhalloween, All Hallows' Eve,] or All Saints' Eve, is a celebration observed in many countries on 31 October, the eve of the Western Christian feast of All Hallows' Day. It begins the observance of Allhallowtide, the time in the liturgical year dedicated to remembering the dead, including saints (hallows), martyrs, and all the faithful departed.

One theory holds that many Halloween traditions may have been influenced by ancient Celtic harvest festivals, particularly the Gaelic festival Samhain, which may have had pagan roots; some scholars hold that Samhain may have been Christianized as All Hallow's Day, along with its eve, by the early Church. Other academics believe, however, that Halloween began solely as a Christian holiday, being the vigil of All Hallow's Day.

Carpinteria Valley Museum of History

On August 21st, the Santa Barbara and the Ventura Model A clubs toured the Carpinteria Area and after lunch landed at the Carpinteria Valley Museum of History. The museum shows everything from early Indian culture, through the Californio period to early ranchos and then early 20th century history of the Carpinteria Valley.



Along with all the artifacts from these periods, this group was particularly interested in one item that sits in the middle of the floor of the museum, a 1928 Model A pickup.

This pickup was donated to the museum in 1991 by Jonathan Brown. It had been used for years on the Brown family farm in Carpinteria, spending its time in a barn when not transporting cherimoya, passion fruit, pineapple guava and other things. It has not been restored, though it did get a new vinyl

roof, upholstery, wooden planking in the bed and a "faithful to original" paint job in the 1960s.

Of interest to the group was its Tillotson carburetor and a Model A heater manifold kit. If anyone can identify the manifold, I would appreciate it. It looks almost exactly the same as what can be found in modern catalogs, but I don't know when it was added. The engine does turn over and could probably run, but it is extremely difficult to get it out through the doors of the museum.





As most people were leaving, we found out that Robin Machado is related to the person in the photo cutout used in the Californio Rancho display! The photo is of Madeline "Nellie" Ayala. Robin's first husband was Nellie's nephew. The Ayala family was the first Spanish family to be granted land in Carpinteria Valley by the Presidio de Santa Barbara. Carpinteria Valley was considered "Pueblo Lands," part of the Pueblo de Santa Barbara.

The Book Column

Hamnet

by Maggie O'Farrell

This book is the fictional story of Shakespeare's son, Hamnet, who died at age 11 in 1596. That is the nutshell summary of this book, but there is a whole lot more.

First of all, there is an amazing parallel between this period in history (late 1500s) that was devastated by the plague, and the one we're living in right now.

Secondly, there is the phenomenal ability of some writers to pluck out a single fact of history and turn it into a riveting story. And who write *really* well.

Hamnet as a name was commonly used in those days, and could be spelled as Hamnet or Hamlet. Was there a connection between the use of this name by William Shakespeare in his play Hamlet and the name of his son? Did he intend to make such a connection? We will never really know, but the author speculates that the connection is there, subtly and strongly through the plot of Hamlet and not by any easily spotted reference. It will be up to the reader to decide if the author is right or not.

My greatest interest in this book lay in the characters so clearly and purely defined. The mother of Hamnet, Agnes Hathaway was an older woman who worked with medicinal herbs and married the young Shakespeare against everyone's wishes. Choosing to remain in Stratford, rather than join him in London where he worked in the theatre, she cared for her very sick child, the twin sister of Hamnet. Judith didn't die, but recovered from the plague. The twist in the "plot" was that she survived after being ill for a very long time, while Hamnet died suddenly and inexplicably. Did he choose to die to save his sister? It sounds like a Shakespearean plot to me!

Don't take my word for it, this book is a GOOD read! It won Women's Prize for Fiction, and the National Book Critics Circle Award.


