Welcome to April! We are looking forward to a fun Spring and Summer. I'll be going to my first CCRG with John this month. Club vice-



Eric Salter Award!







Gledhill Library by Janet Cox





Letter from a Charter Member

During our quest to find out who the Charter members of our club are, we have been lucky to have made contact with Ralph Nair. Ralph has sent us a SB News Press article in August of 1959 printed just before the SB MAFCA chapter was granted December 5, 1959. He said he sure hopes that we are able to retrieve the original charter document that Bill Berger had in his possession and showed him a year or two before he passed away. On the back were the signatures of the original members which included Bill and Ralph. See articles on pgs. 9 & 10



Ralph was age 15 in 1959 when he restored this 1930 Cabriolet with his dad and was a charter member of SBMAFC

He wrote, "Bill Berger was our mentor and consultant and became a great friend. He says that it was Ron Ryker that remained in SB and participated in the club after it's founding while my life took me away from SB until I retired about seven years ago and moved back. While I was away from SB, my Dad, (same name as me) participated in the club from time to time as he had purchased a 1931 Deluxe Roadster and worked many years to restore it."



On August 15th the Santa Barbara Chapter became the tenth organization of Model A owners to be authorized for chapter affiliation with the Model A Ford Club of America.

Santa Barbara, a beautiful coast city about 95 miles north of Los Angeles, is known, among other things, as the site of one of California's oldest missions. In the realm of vintage cars, the area is also well known as a real hot-bed of Model A Ford enthusiasm—the place many well preserved and finely restored A's call home.

Considerable more enthusiasm was created in the area in July when a contingent of cars from the Los Angeles club journeyed there for a day of activities. (See pages 16 and 17.)

Organization of the Santa Barbara Chapter was spearheaded by Bill Berger, who has long been associated with Model A clubs. He not only served two terms as president of the Northern California Model A Restorers Club, but also, previously, until called away on business, was one of the original founding members of our club when it started back in 1955.

To Bill, who we hope is back in southern California to stay awhile, and to our new Santa Barbara Chapter...a big rousing welcome.




SANTA BARBARA CHAPTER


