Chocolate Peanut Butter Cornflake Cookies

Ingredients "Sweet and salty, these cookies are quick and easy to make, requiring only 3 ingredients."



- 1 cup chocolate chips
- 2 tablespoons peanut butter
- 3 cups cornflakes

Directions

- 1. Combine chocolate chips and peanut butter in a saucepan over low heat; cook and stir until melted, 2 to 3 minutes. Stir in cornflakes until coated.
- 2. Drop spoonfuls of the cornflake mixture onto a baking sheet lined with waxed paper. Chill in the refrigerator until cool, about 30 minutes.

Re: Top Bows

Your question: My main problem is the roof getting it right with height of hood bows

Answer: I just got a call from "Wood for Fords / Fordwood". Anna and Henry Cubels own and manage the company and were very helpful to provide me with some information that my help you with your question. They said that all the top bows for your 1928 Tudor should have a arc of 7/8 inch. All the top bows have the same arc. With the bow sitting on a flat surface and the ends resting on the flat surface, the center of the bow will be 7/8" from the flat surface to the bottom of the bow.

The best place I have found for instructions and pictures on how to install the top material on a 1928 Tudor is on the website provided by Marco Tahtaras.
